Edward W. Bullard

Inventor of the Hard Hat

U.S. PATENT NO. 1,699,133

- 1. Bullard was born in 1893 in Las Vegas, New Mexico.
- 2. He attended Lowell High School in San Francisco, California.
- 3. While attending the University of California, Berkeley, Bullard was a member of the Beta Theta Pi fraternity.
- 4. He served for nine months in the cavalry in the U.S. Army in France during World War I.
- 5. He attained the rank of lieutenant in the Army.
- 6. The E.D. Bullard Co. was founded in 1898 in San Francisco by Bullard's father, Edward Dickinson Bullard. The company is now led by Wells Bullard, Edward W. Bullard's great-granddaughter.
- 7. He served as the chair of the rescue division for the city and county of San Francisco during World War II.
- 8. The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) annually awards the Bullard-Sherwood Research-to-Practice Award for exceptional efforts by NIOSH researchers and partners in applying occupational safety and health research to the prevention of workplace fatalities, illnesses or injuries.
- 9. He died in 1963 in Greenbrae, California.
- 10. Bullard held 13 U.S. patents.
