10 Things You Need to Know About

Polly Smith

Inventor of the Sports Bra

- 1. Smith met future Jogbra[®] co-inventor Lisa Lindahl in eighth grade when they both lived in Montclair, New Jersey.
- 2. Smith's ties to Vermont (where she worked on the Jogbra) began when she was young and would visit her family's cabin there throughout her childhood.
- 3. Creativity ran in Smith's family, as her mother was a quilter and her grandfather was an illustrator.
- 4. She began sewing her own clothes in eighth grade and credits both her mother and a home economics class for teaching her the skill.
- 5. She earned her bachelor's degree in fashion design from Moore College of Art & Design, as well as a master's degree in costume design from New York University.
- 6. Smith designed the first sports bra while working as a costume designer for the Champlain Shakespeare Festival in Burlington in 1977.
- 7. The original Jogbra prototype that Smith designed utilized Lycra and elastic, with a first-of-its-kind cross back that the sports bra is known for today.
- 8. Smith landed her "dream job" working in costume design for The Jim Henson Co. in 1978 and designed for several "Muppets" television and film projects.
- 9. Smith has won seven Emmy awards for her work on "Sesame Street" and she has been nominated for the award several times.
- 10. She holds three U.S. patents.
